
## **AWAY**

for several musicians with at least one piano

- 1. The piece begins and ends with quiet chimed piano pulses (see the following piano score).
- 2. The cells can be played from left to right or from right to left. Play each note for one normal breath, one bow, etc...
- 3. Begin a cell, or listen and play the next note in a cell started by someone else. Make sure the piano can be heard by all.
- 4. One person may inadvertently start more than one cell at a time with a common note (i.e. D flat, F, A flat). This is fine.
- 5. When a cell finishes, each person should either follow the arrows to another cell or listen for another opening.
- 6. No one person should play an entire cell by him or herself. It's okay it if trails off because no one follows you.
- 7. Follow the piano's pacing. When all instruments are finished, we should just hear the piano chimes, which slowly fade down.



## (piano score)

for piano(s) and any combination of instruments
(see separate instrumental score: they are playing slowly and not in time with you)
repeat each section as you like before moving on.
listen to instrumentalists to pace yourselves.
you play alone on A and Q.
